

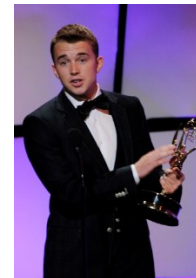
Emmy Award-Winning Actors and Georgia Natives Kyle Chandler and Chandler Massey, Along with Country Music Star and Jefferson, Georgia's Corey Smith, To Lend Their Talents to Help Tell the Incredible World War II Escape Story of Jefferson, Georgia Native Damon "Rocky" Gause

Kingston, Rhode Island-August 26, 2014-The World War II Foundation is excited to announce that three very well-known Georgia names will be lending their voices and talents to the one-hour documentary chronicling the incredible World War II escape of Jefferson, Georgia native Damon "Rocky" Gause.



**Kyle Chandler**, Prime-Time Emmy Award-winning actor for his role in NBC's Friday Night Lights as head coach Eric Taylor, will be narrating the documentary. Kyle is also a University of Georgia graduate, as was Damon Gause. Chandler, from Social Circle, Georgia has also starred in many other television shows and movies including: *The Wolf of Wall Street*, *Zero Dark Thirty*, *Argo*, *Super 8* and the television series *Early Edition*.

Former *Days of Our Lives* multiple Daytime Emmy Award-winning actor **Chandler Massey**, an Atlanta, Georgia native, will be voicing the role of Damon "Rocky" Gause in the documentary.



Massey received the 2012 Daytime Emmy Award for Outstanding Younger Actor in a Drama Series. He won his second and third consecutive Emmy awards in the category in 2013 and 2014. Massey has also appeared in the television series *One Tree Hill* and *Army Wives*. He also was seen in HBO's *Eastbound and Down*.



Jefferson, Georgia native and another UGA grad, Country Music star **Corey Smith**, will be lending his voice to the documentary as "Rocky" Gause's escape partner William Lloyd Osborne. Smith, one of country music's emerging talents, will also be providing much of the music for the film.



The non-profit World War II Foundation has produced 11 WWII documentary films to date, winning both regional Emmy Awards for their work and two recent international awards from the Indie Film Fest. The WWII Foundation was one of just five organizations recognized with a National Programming Excellence Award in 2013 by American Public Television.
